



# Real Time Transportation Information Displays

## TDM MEASURE:

The Development Project shall provide real time transportation information on displays (e.g., large television screens or computer monitors) in prominent locations (e.g., entry/ exit areas, lobbies, elevator bays) on the project site to highlight sustainable transportation options and support informed trip-making. At minimum, a Development Project should include such screens at each major entry/exit.

The displays shall include real time information on sustainable transportation options in the vicinity of the project site, which may include, but are not limited to, transit arrivals and departures for nearby transit routes, walking times to these locations, and the availability of car-share vehicles (within or adjacent to the building), shared bicycles, and shared scooters.

## APPLICABILITY:

**This measure is applicable to Development Projects in any land use category, particularly if the project site is within 1/4 mile of the Muni Rapid Transit Network and/or a regional transit hub (such as a Caltrain or BART station).**

## POINTS:

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DEVELOPMENT REVIEW: The property owner shall submit plans that identify the general locations for proposed displays and a description of the content (e.g., transit lines, walk time to transit locations, availability of on-site car-share vehicles, availability of nearby bike share bikes, etc.) to be displayed. City staff shall review the proposed plan to ensure that the display placement and content meets the intent of this measure.

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PRE-OCCUPANCY MONITORING AND REPORTING: The TDM coordinator shall facilitate a site inspection by Planning Department staff to verify that real time transportation information display(s) have been installed and are functioning as specified in the project approvals.

Additionally, City staff shall provide the TDM coordinator with a copy of the approved TDM Plan. The TDM coordinator will provide City Staff with a signed letter agreeing to distribute the TDM Plan via new employee packets, tenant lease documents, and/or deeds.

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ONGOING MONITORING AND REPORTING: The property owner shall submit photographs of the displays. City staff shall verify the ongoing maintenance and operation of the displays. City staff will perform one site visit every three years to verify that the project continues to meet the standards specified in the project approvals.
